BOOK INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the official support documentation for **The Pekoe Trail Sri Lanka**. Since transitioning from a donor-funded project to a formalized nonprofit steward managed by **The Pekoe Trail Organisation (TPTO)**, our priority is to protect this national asset while ensuring you have a safe, life-enriching, and "serendipitous" journey through our highlands.

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CHAPTER 1: PLANNING YOUR HIKE & SEASONAL OPERATIONS

Is the entire 300km trail open, and how long does it take?

“ **Quick Summary:** The trail is fully open across all 22 stages. To walk the entire trail from end-to-end typically takes between **16 to 22 days**.”

? Detailed Guidance

The Pekoe Trail is a curated **300-kilometer (186-mile)** long-distance walking trail that winds through the Central Highlands of Sri Lanka.

- **Flexible Pacing:** Each of the 22 stages ranges from **9 to 18 kilometers**, taking approximately **4 to 6 hours** to complete per day.
- **Independently Accessible:** You do not have to hike the entire trail. Every stage begins and ends near transport links and can be completed as a standalone day hike.
- **Direction:** The trail is fully waymarked and can be hiked in either direction.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Physical Fitness:** The trail has an average difficulty rating of **6.5 out of 10** (graded as Moderate to Difficult). Ensure you are in good health before treading.

Can I hike during the monsoon season?

“ **Quick Summary:** While the trail is technically accessible year-round, hiking during the heavy monsoons (May-June and September-December) is challenging due to rain, thick mist, and leeches.

? Detailed Guidance

If you plan to walk during wet weather, be prepared for the following:

- **Rapid Weather Changes:** Temperatures drop dramatically in the highlands during heavy rain. Visibility can decrease to near-zero within minutes due to heavy mist.
- **Leeches:** High dampness increases the presence of forest and tea estate leeches. They are harmless but require careful removal (slide a fingernail under their base to unstick them).

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Early Finishes:** High rainfall means it gets dark much faster. Plan to complete your stage by **2:00 PM** to avoid being stranded in the dark.
- **Essential Gear:** Carry heavy-duty wet weather gear, a backup power bank, a personal first-aid kit, and short gaiters to block leeches.

CHAPTER 2: NAVIGATION, SAFETY & CONNECTIVITY

How do I navigate the trail? Is it well-marked?

“**Quick Summary:** Most stages have physical directional signs and trailhead boards, but you must carry a digital GPS backup (like our official app or Wikiloc/AllTrails profiles).”

? Detailed Guidance

- **Infrastructure:** Physical signposts exist at key trail junctions, but they can occasionally be obscured by vegetation or altered by weather.
- **Digital Navigation:** Our official mobile app offers real-time GPS tracking and offline interactive maps with turn-by-turn navigation.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Safety Warning:** Do not attempt to hike remote segments alone without downloading offline maps first. High-altitude valleys frequently suffer from complete mobile signal dropouts.
- **Off-Track Alerts:** Enable the off-track alerts feature in your hiking app to be immediately notified if you wander off the historical estate paths.

Emergency contacts and protocols on the trail

“ ☐ **Quick Summary:** In a medical or safety emergency, call the national emergency line at **1990**.

? Detailed Guidance

- **Local Village Support:** If lost or minorly injured, make your way to the closest tea plucker shelter or local village. Plantation communities are highly welcoming and can arrange local transport (such as a Tuk-Tuk).
- **Disaster Management Hotline:** If affected by extreme weather, immediately call **117** (Disaster Management Center).

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Solo Hiker Protocol:** Solo hikers are advised to carry **two mobile phones** (on different local networks, such as Dialog and Mobitel) and an external battery pack.

CHAPTER 3: MEMBERSHIPS, PASSES, AND PAYMENTS

Why do I need a Trail Pass and how much does it cost?

“**Quick Summary:** Trail Passes are mandatory for every stage. A pass costs **USD 10** for foreign visitors and **LKR 600** for Sri Lankan residents.

? Detailed Guidance

- **Why it Matters:** The Pekoe Trail crosses private properties, government reserve lands, and working tea estates. Your pass directly funds the upkeep of the path, community infrastructure, and conservation.
- **Under-12 Policy:** Children under the age of 12 hike completely free when accompanied by a paying adult.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Non-Transferable:** Passes are locked to your registered email address and the specific date/stage booked. Ensure the digital pass is on your mobile device at all times during your walk.

Troubleshooting Payment Decline (Error Code 491)

“📄 **Quick Summary:** Error 491 is a card security decline. It happens because our payment gateway uses 3D Secure (3DS) and requires 2-Factor Authentication (OTP).

? Detailed Guidance

- **The Gateway:** Payments on our portal are processed through Cybersource (owned by Visa), requiring strict security checks to block malicious bots.
- **The Solution:** Try checking out with an alternative card that has 3D Secure / OTP enabled. If your international bank blocks the transaction, you may need to call them to authorize a payment to Sri Lanka.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Charged but No Pass?** If your card was charged but you did not receive your pass due to a page timeout, email info@thepekoetrailsrilanka.com with your payment receipt PDF, registered email, and the stage date. Our team will manually verify and issue the pass.

Understanding the 7-Day & 3-Month Memberships

“📄 **Quick Summary:** Active memberships allow you to book unlimited trail passes directly through the app at no extra charge.

? Detailed Guidance

For hikers planning to tackle multiple stages or spend an extended season in Sri Lanka, our short-term memberships provide seamless, card-free access.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Immediate Activation:** Memberships are valid immediately from the exact moment of purchase. You cannot post-date or select a future start date.
- **Hike Booking Required:** You must still book the individual stage passes on the app for the specific days you hike. The pass unlocks the official offline maps for that stage specifically on your hike date.

CHAPTER 4: TRANSIT, TRAIN SCHEDULES, AND LUGGAGE

Badulla to Ambewela Special Train Schedule (Class S14 Hero)

“📄 **Quick Summary:** Reopened in December 2025, the upcountry rail line utilizes special Class S14 Hero train sets. They are highly convenient for skipping weather-heavy sections or commuting between key trailheads.

? Detailed Guidance

The scenic railway intersects directly with several trail stages around Haputale, Ella, and Demodara.

- **Wednesday Warning:** These special Class S14 transit runs **do not operate on Wednesdays**.
- **Reservations:** Bookings are open and can be made online at seatreservation.railway.gov.lk/mtktwebslr/ or directly at reservation-enabled highland stations.

Luggage transfer from stage to stage

“ **Quick Summary:** The Pekoe Trail Organisation (TPTO) does not operate a direct luggage transport service.

? Detailed Guidance

Because we are a nonprofit focused purely on trail maintenance and community preservation, we do not manage guest baggage shipping.

- **Alternative Solutions:** 1. Coordinate with your specific hotel or guesthouse. Most highland properties can organize a local Tuk-Tuk or private driver to ship your bags to your next stop for a small fee. 2. Book your trip through registered Destination Management Companies (DMCs) or tour operators who manage full vehicle-supported luggage transfers.

CHAPTER 5: RESPONSIBLE HIKING & ETHICAL POLICIES

Ethical travel: Interacting with local children and families

“📌 **Quick Summary:** **DO NOT** give money, sweets, or gifts directly to children or individuals on the trail.

? Detailed Guidance

The Pekoe Trail winds through estate communities whose trust is built on mutual respect. Giving loose cash or handouts directly to children:

- Encourages school absenteeism.
- Disrupts local family structures and social equity.
- Creates harmful cycles of tourist dependency.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **How to Give Ethically:** If you wish to make a real impact on the local communities, consider contributing directly to TPTO's structured community development funds, or support local businesses by dining at village eateries and hiring community guides.

Environmental standards & camping restrictions

“ **Quick Summary:** Wild camping is prohibited across almost all stages of the trail to preserve working tea estates and sensitive ecosystems.

? Detailed Guidance

- **Leave No Trace:** You are traversing a highly sensitive agricultural and natural corridor. Bring all wrappers, plastics, and trash back to your hotel. Biopiracy is punishable by law.
- **Bikes and Vehicles:** Motorized vehicles and mountain bikes are strictly banned on the narrow estate footpaths. This prevents conflicts with estate workers and preserves the physical condition of the trail.

?? Critical Alerts & Requirements

- **Approved Stays:** Hikers are required to spend their nights in verified local accommodations, hotels, or homestays. The only officially designated, authorized wild camping spot is at **Haritha Kanda** on Stage 9.
